## HOW'S REMOTE LEARNING GOING?

### ...It's been a big challenge.

- There's no shortage of problems surrounding remote learning during the pandemic—and these are compounded by communication problems and tensions between K-5 teachers and parents.
- Already vulnerable student populations are disproportionately affected:
  - Title I school systems
  - Low-income households
  - SPED students

#### **TECH**

- Lack of Internet access
- Limits on schools' tech loans (e.g., one laptop per household)
- Onscreen learning feels nonintuitive and less engaging

#### TIME

Most struggle to balance the competing demands of work, parenting, and homeschooling

Poor communication and unclear expectation has led to a sense of tension between parents and teachers



#### When and how can we get back into classrooms?

Remote learning feels like a poor substitute for classroom learning, so parents and teachers alike are eager to return to classrooms. Premature reopening is a major worry. Not only are they wary of a second (and potentially worse) wave of COVID-19 and facing more or longer lockdowns, but most believe masks and social distancing guidelines are unrealistic for K-5 students and may have adverse emotional and social impacts.

WHAT ARE THE TOP CONCERNS ABOUT SAFETY GUIDELINES?





Can we really do social distancing throughout our facility, and will it cause emotional damage?

- Social/emotional impact of discouraging sharing, interaction
- High contact/large group periods (lunch, recess, gym)
- Physical facility: short hallways, narrow stairwells, etc



Is it realistic to expect K-5 students to wear masks all day—and will it scare them?

- Younger children, SPED students, and those with sensory issues unlikely to tolerate all-day wear
- Frightening environment



Who will foot the bill for PPE requirements?

- Budgets already cut
- Financial burden on individual families

"I don't think it's realistic, and I don't want to sit there and see all my sweet little babies in masks...like it's a doctor's office. I can't even breathe when I have a mask on while I'm grocery shopping. It's absolutely ridiculous to think young kids could. How do you go 6-7 hours a day wearing one?" (Teacher)

"I can't expect to my seven-year-old to wear a mask all day and, even if that was something that were to happen, how would they make sure that everybody had a mask? I just was like, 'how are they going to get funding for that?'" (Parent)

### How can schools reopen successfully? Tailored solutions, lots of flexibility, and great communication.

so allow for flexible
returns
